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March Madness: 3rd Annual Long Distance Sail

Between Buford Dam and Brown's Bridge on Scenic Lake Lanier

The Purpose

A fun event that will benefit Parent to Parent which provides support and resources to families of disabled children or those with special health needs. They have made a direct and positive impact on families within the club.

You may either have sponsors pledge an amount for the distance you sail or donate an entry pledge. This is NOT a race.

The Route

Depending upon the wind direction, we will sail the lower part of Lake Lanier between Buford Dam and Brown's Bridge. Depending upon wind strength, the course is subject to be shortened. Expected end points and rest stops are:

- West Bank Park at Buford Dam
- Van Pugh Park
- Lake Lanier Sailing Club

As the crow flies, this distance is about 12 miles. If the wind is S, SW, W to NW we will sail from the dam to the bridge. If it is N, NE, E, SE, we will start at the bridge. Tune into NOAA or the Weather Channel for predicted directions. Call 770-578-8417 or check the ABC website, the night before or the same day if in doubt. If the predicted wind is less than 10 mph or stronger than 30 mph, we will most likely wait until Sunday. Anything between, we will sail. (yes, non-planing conditions, too.)

Who can participate?

Because of the distance and possibility of rapidly changing conditions, the event itself is for experienced and competent windsurfers only. We invite anyone else to give us a hand with transporting equipment, chase boats, and rest stops. While we intend to have chase boats on the water to aid sailors, each sailor must be prepared for the diverse conditions Lake Lanier can present in

the Spring- from virtual calm to wall-to-wall whitecaps.

Wind Makeup Date

The club may determine that wind conditions are insufficient to permit safe sailing of the course. In such case, we will attempt to sail on the following day. If wind conditions during the weekend due not permit safe sailing, the club may elect to cancel the event but all pledges and donations will still be due.

The Rules

Rules? Yes, there are two rules: 1) We do this sail by 'go-kart' rules- the faster windsurfers in the front of the group sail back to back so we all try to stay together. 2) Smile and have fun.

Logistics

We will provide transportation for boards and sailors back to the starting point. We will also try to provide that additional equipment will be brought to the intermediate rest areas to allow sailors to rig if conditions change.

The Goodies

It's only a \$10 pledge to join the fun. Pledge or raise \$20 and you get a **nifty T-shirt** as a bonus and which in years past have been in great demand. Think big ; get \$50 in pledges and you get a **handy Windsense uphaul** to add to your booty. And if you raise \$100, we'll throw in a cushy set of **Windsense rack**

Expected conditions and suggested equipment

It will be March after all, and as the last two years have shown, expect anything. If the wind looks the least bit iffy, a longboard is **highly** recommended. Also, this is Georgia, bring a big sail. If the wind is less than a steady 15, most sailors would benefit from something at least as big as a 7.5² m. (your mileage may vary with weight and rig).

I see this problem quite often. You and your board, after seasons of happiness, seem stuck in a rut. I think there is hope for your situation but it will take work from both of you. The solution is straightforward- you aren't going anywhere because you're sailing back and forth (BAFing).

The next time you are at your favorite sailing spot, try this. Go upwind. Yes, it may seem hard at first, but you'll discover new horizons out there. You'll explore parts of the lake/beach you may not have seen before- new islands, channels, scenery. It may take either sailing powered up on your shortboard or that trusty daggerboard on that ol' log of yours. Either way, you and your steady will discover new pastures together.

Dear S in S:


Sometimes these situations can be overcome, but in a case like yours, once you've tried monofilm, you can never go back to dacron, no matter how lovely and colorful it is. And that is the danger of being unfaithful to your old gear. You might find that it really doesn't compare to the new lovelies on the street. Be careful though and don't step out too often or you'll find yourself in an expensive, vicious, and ultimately fruitless circle of comparing new stuff to the stuff you own.

Dear Dr. Fray:

This is awkward but I need to ask someone. Is my fin big enough? I mean, will it take me where I want to go?

Dear Mr George Ladella of 261 Elm Street. Doraville, GA.

Fin size can be overrated. While the new wide boards can carry a big fin, older and smaller boards sail fine with something more moderate. It's easy to look at the new 50 cm rapiers

some new epoxy wonders and feel that your fin is inadequate. But your 275 convertible will be happy with something much smaller. A nice little swept 32 cm fin will have you whooping it up with delight.

Dear Dr. Fray:

Even though I'm middle-aged, I've never been on a board before. Is it too late at my age to get started windsurfing?

Dear Still Ticking,

Windsurfing is truly a sport that can be enjoyed by all ages. At our seniors last fall, we had sailors almost 80 competing. Just make sure that you start with quality instruction and that initial awkwardness will quickly fade. Soon, you'll be having fun like the rest of us.

Dr. Fray:

My gear and I are separated. Is there anything I can do to keep us together?

Dear Lonely,

Next time, don't use bungee cords you bought at *Big Lots*. Don't tie down \$2000 worth of windsurfing gear with a cheap rubber band- invest in some decent tie-downs. If you don't care anymore about your gear, don't be surprised when it takes off down the highway without you.

Dear Dr. Fray:

I'm getting to the point in my relationship with my board that I need to start using the harness but I'm a little scared that it will hurt. I really want to start sailing longer than 15 minutes at a time when the wind blows more than 10 mph- and it would make my board so happy, too. I've heard about catapults and other such incidents and I don't think I can do it if it will cause me pain.

Can you advise me?

Dear Knuckle-dragger,

That's right, that's what used to happen to folks in the old days, pre-harness, who sailed for extended periods of time. Their ARMS would stretch. You have to get over your fears. We can tell you that the pain of sailing without a harness much exceeds whatever discomfort a catapult may bring. And frankly, catapults don't happen that frequently- especially as you begin to use those footstraps. By using your harness and footstraps you can have a closer relationship with your board. You'll both be happier.
